What do Dr. Steven Gallinger, Dr. Hoursheng He, Dr. Andrew Markrigiannis and Dr. McPherson all have in common? Their research grants are either fully or partially funded by WICC!

As you might expect, genome sequencing research (for example) takes a lot of time and money to get to the point where it can actually help a person who's been affected by cancer. Thanks to funds raised this research has become a reality with real-world impact.

It's NOW incredible to think that although it took the doctor six years and \$3 billion to code the first genome, the Ontario Institute for Cancer Research (OICR) now has machines that can sequence a genome overnight!

This research was funded by a Canadian Cancer Society Impact Grant. Libby Znaimer (WICC's 2014 Breakfast speaker) was one of the first individuals to receive Dr. Gallinger's innovative treatment. Libby is alive today because of this Doctor's cutting edge research, much like that which is also funded by WICC.

Since its inception, the WICC Ontario Chapter has always dedicated 100% of its funds to various types of research and more recently, to research grant funding. WICC wants to place the funds raised where our National Sponsors and our very supportive P&C community say they want us to dedicate them.

Impactful milestones include:

- ⇒ Provincial Chapter formations (1999 through 2009)
- ⇒ WICC / CCS partnership. Secured 100% of funds raised to be dedicated to research, bypassing admin. costs (1999)
- ⇒ National Sponsorship program launched. Annual donation commitments help WICC with more proactive event planning and pushed annual funds to new levels (2004)
- ⇒ Relay For Life WICC Event launch created new interest and incremental funds for CCS (2009)
- ⇒ Innovation Grant funding began a more tangible way to highlight the impact of funds given to CCS by WICC (2011)


A truly global event taking place every year on February 4th, World Cancer Day unites the world's population in the fight against cancer.
